Applying to Teacher Training Programs

All applications to teacher training programs in Ontario are handled by the Ontario Universities Application Centre. Please visit their online [Teacher Education Application Service \(TEAS\)](#) for information about all Bachelor of Education programs in Ontario and to apply to those programs. The deadline to apply for 2009 admission entry is **Friday, November 28th, 2008**.

Of the 13 Universities in Ontario that offer teacher training degrees in Ontario, 11 offer J/I and/or I/S teachable subjects in Health and Physical Education.

Second Teachable Subjects

A second teachable subject is required for all Intermediate/Senior B. Ed. programs offered in Ontario. Teachable subject prerequisite requirements vary widely between B.Ed. programs in Ontario. Please refer to the [TEAS 2009 Instruction Booklet](#) (PDF) and the host institution for specific teachable subject requirements and acceptable courses.

New for 2009 OISE/UT now requires at least 3-5 credits in a subject area for second teachable subject purposes. Please refer to their [Teaching Subject and Prerequisite Guide](#) for details.

Primary Junior: Kindergarten – Grade 6

There are no teachable subject requirements for Primary/Junior programs. Many P/J B.Ed. programs do specify some prerequisites or preferences for P/J applicants. Refer to the TEAS 2009 Instruction Booklet for details of these requirements.

Preparation for Teaching Option in the BPHE Program

Under an agreement between the Faculty of Physical Education and Health and OISE / UT, OISE / UT will give "preferred entry status" to BPHE graduates who:

- 1) successfully complete PHE331H Teaching the Child Physical Activity, with a minimum grade of "B";
- 2) successfully complete PHE450Y Leadership Placement II in a Faculty-approved practice teaching placement. (PHE350Y is a prerequisite for PHE450Y)
- 3) achieve at least a B average in 15 full course academic equivalents, completed before the fall term of their year of application to OISE / UT; and
- 4) present a strong applicant profile form.

Graduating students who would like to apply for the Preferred Entry list this year must submit the [Preparation for Teaching Application Form](#) to the Undergraduate Program Office by October 31, 2008.

PHE350Y Leadership Placement I and PHE450Y Leadership Placement II

The BPHE program offers a third and fourth year professional placement academic course in practice teaching settings for students who wish to explore the teaching profession and strengthen their applicant profile. Registration procedures and information sessions for the 2009-10 placement courses will likely begin in January 2009.
